On or about May 19, 2022, Bryant Mehay announced to those present in the Open Art Studio of the Center on Colfax, "We need a name for the group piece." Michael King looked up, replied, "GROUP PEACE" and returned to mixing paint. I had been wondering the last few weeks if the museum people, even if the "Dads" for that matter (Jason Eaton and Bryant Mehay) were cognizant that these artists, (ok, me too) are not just stubborn old folks. 

Vermicomposting with the Denver Urban Gardens

Vermicomposting: Composting with red wiggler worms, is an easy, low - cost way to reuse non-meat food scraps, extend the composting season, and also use simple bedding materials for your worms. The process can be done indoors, year - round, utilizing a simple storage container. The product, vermicompost, can be utilized as a rich soil amendment in your outdoor garden and extra worms shared with friends to continue the cycle.
