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ICE CREAM Meet & Mingle SOCIAL!

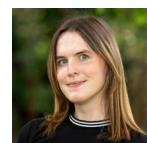

West of 50's all because of YOU— I cant believe it but we are over half way through the year. When I look back and I think about everything we have accomplished I am shocked. I want to take this time and THANK YOU for your ideas, feedback, and commitment to The Center. We are able to do what we LOVE because of YOU! Over the past several months we have changed our name, built an art exhibit, created new programming, built new community led programs, I am sure I have I have missed something. But here is a look at how many people we have interacted with in the second quarter. **Thank you** for all the Love—Jason

During quarter 2, the West of Fifty program served 75 unduplicated individuals through programming; 30 of those individuals were new to the Center. Participants were served by Center programming on average over 11 times during the second quarter. The 31 events facilitated by the West of Fifty program were attended by a total of 634 individuals over the second quarter; 461 of those individuals were new to the Center. Participation rose by 277% from Quarter 1 due to an increase in the amount and variety of events including pride-related events. The most notable events were:

- Choir Boy: 20 participants
- Eye of the Beholder: 16 participants
- Georgetown Railroad: 11 participants
- Name Reveal Party: 17 participants
- Spectrum LGBTQ Training: 26 participants
- Tea Dance: 56 participants
- Ken Felts PrideFest: 19 participants
- 6.25 Pride BINGO: 120 participants
- PrideFest Telling Our Story: 16 participants
- 6.25 Pride BINGO 190 participants

Queer Reproductive Health- This past August the AARP Community Group started constructing hygiene kits for individuals who are traveling to Colorado to seek abortions. Since the overturning of Roe vs. Wade the state has seen the wait time for individuals seeking this care increase to two weeks (CPR News). Patients looking for an abortion could expect longer wait times due to the surging demand as states continue to limit or prevent a persons ability to access medical care (CPR News). Many



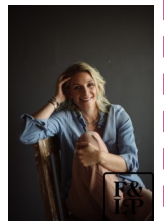
people assume this issue only affects the straight community. Queer, trans, nonbinary, and intersex people become pregnant as well. Sexuality and gender are fluid, and people love and have sex with people of varying gender identities. Wetesify.org reports that lesbian, gay, and bisexual youth are twice as likely to experience an unintended pregnancy or get someone pregnant and bisexual young women are more likely to experience a pregnancy. Additional, queer and trans people experience high rates of sexual assault and rape, leading to a need for queer trauma-informed reproductive healthcare and abortion access.



Learning to See - Smartphone photography class—This open format class will be a chance to explore our surroundings from a different perspective. Using the camera as a tool to Look and See. As the instructor I will guide individuals in Observation, Skills/Techniques, Professional showcasing and artist submissions. "Talking About Sex Won't Make You Pregnant & Talking About Death Won't Make You Dead"- Gail Ruben



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Older, Wiser, Sexual Smarter-Join the West of 50 Team as we reexamine what it means to be sexual later in life. Each week we will unpack topics and activities that will spark engaging conversations and remind you that sex at any age can be enjoyable and that you are worthy of love and intimacy. The following is an example of what you can look forward to learning about:

-Got a second wind? Sexuality in mid & later life: This session explores the keys to continuous pleasure and health for individuals in later in life. Participants identify their expectations regarding sex when they were young, in midlife, and their later years. they examine the changes in sexual response, the concept of "Good-Enough Sex," and guidelines for sexual health and happiness as they age

-Skin Hunger: Everyone needs Touch: In this session, participants learn psychological facts that support the universal need for touch. They discuss cultural messages that affect our attitudes about body contact and learn to give a receive a message of the hand.

-Everyone Deserves Respect: Love the Skin You're in!: In a society that extols young, beautiful, and perfect bodies through incessant media messages, it can be difficult to respect one's naturally aging body. Participants examine the evolution of cultural messages about beauty in the U.S. and the current marketing of body Makeovers. This session encourages participants to appreciate their bodies, however imperfect they may be, as they evaluate the impact of body images on sexuality.

-Exploring Online Relationships: This session helps participants feel more comfortable using apps and the internet to form a relationship and access sexual information while identifying and eliminating possible online dangers. Participants develop a personal advertisement describing themselves (or a friend) and the potential partner they might seek.

-Good Sex: What makes it So?: In this session, participants identify the qualities of a good lover. They explore ways people can have " good sex" with "outcourse" - sex that is non-penetrative and focuses on the whole body rather than just the genitals.

-From Problems to Possibilities: Sexuality, Aging, Disability, & Chronic Illness: Participants examine the many sexual problems that are a profound reality for people who are aging, disabled, or have a chronic illness. This session encourages people to accept the challenges, understand the possibilities, and explore new ways of being sexual - despite, and because of, the difficulties that confront them.

-Not Only for the Young: Mix & Match Safer Sex Activities for Older Adults: As adults face relationship changes through separation, divorce, death, and disability, they need current information to prevent sexually transmitted infections. This session is designed to encourage participants to think about their own potentially risky behaviors and understand the importance of safer sex behaviors if they are at risk.

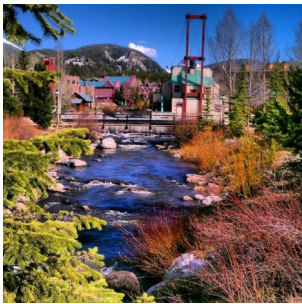
At each session we will introduce a new topic and activities to talk and learn about. This program is designed for older individuals.
